Employment

336,802 Participants with low incomes in employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income or achieved "living wage" income.

Economic Asset Enhancement

14,731 Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or skills.

Child & Family Development

255,861 Infants, children, youth, parents and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations

41,441 Vulnerable individuals with low income received services from the Network and secured or maintained independent living situation as a result.

Family Stability

53,307 Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the Network.

Emergency Assistance

193,931 Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance through the Network.

Community Opportunities and Resources

25,987 Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of Network projects or initiatives or partnerships with other public and/or private agencies.

Community Empowerment

43,800 Community Members and people with low income mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of maximum feasible participation in the Network.
