**Living Wage** - Massachusetts Institute of Technology Living Wage Calculator ([livingwage.mit.edu](http://livingwage.mit.edu)). The wage listed is the wage an individual would need to earn as the sole provider for a household consisting of themselves and one child based on the typical expenses in that county or city. This wage is a minimum estimate of the cost of living for a low wage family.

**Hourly Wage** - Out of Reach 2013, a report of the National Low Income Housing Coalition ([www.nlihc.org](http://www.nlihc.org)). The hourly rate listed is that which one person would need to earn working year round, 40 hours per week in order to afford a 2 bedroom apartment at the fair market rate (FMR) for that county, assuming 30% of income is spent on housing.
